We have every right to be proud of our AGO chapter here in Charlotte! Here's why:

• Did you happen to notice that our Charlotte chapter produced 3 certifications that were the only ones successfully taken in all of North Carolina? Check page



- 49 in the October TAO. (The American Organist magazine) Garrett Law passed the full Associate Exam, Kathie Riebe is now a Colleague (and has study materials she's willing to share), and Danielle Little now has her Service Playing credentials. Danielle was a Stigall Scholar.
- We have produced many organ majors through our Stigall Scholarship program. Summer recitals by those students have been recorded professionally, and will soon be on the national AGO site. This project is called the Legacy Project. (It was begun when Jane Cain was dean.)
- Our chapter has ordered an Orgelkids Kit, (also begun when Jane was dean) which will be
 delivered in the next few months, and we will demonstrate it at an AGO meeting in Spring
 2020. (Please check programming and plan to attend.) With this kit we can teach children (or
 anyone) how an organ works. The small organ can be taken apart and reassembled and then
 played. (I had a class in organ maintenance and design, and never had that opportunity. So I
 intend to learn too!)
- Keep your eyes open for improvements in our AGO website that are coming soon.

Catawba College - Salisbury, North Carolina

Catawba College is a small, faith-based (UCC), liberal arts college located about 45 miles north of Charlotte in the quaint town of Salisbury, NC. The 1000-seat Omwake-Dearborn Chapel, named for two former college presidents, is now 55 years old. At the time of the dedication, an electronic organ was in place but was later replaced by a 42 rank 3 manual Casavant pipe organ. Over the years, the pipe organ fell into disrepair and its baroque tonality fell out of favor. Several attempts were made to either repair the Casavant or replace it. Al Murrell, Vice President of R. A. Daffer Church Organs, Inc., built a strong relationship with Professor Paul Oakley and his successor Dr. Phillip Burgess by providing a Rodgers Organ for several Lessons and Carols services. Because of the relationships Al had built over the years with college personnel, the decision was made to award R. A. Daffer Church Organs, Inc the contract to install a new Rodgers Infinity four manual 84 stop custom organ and interface it with the best 17 ranks of the Casavant. This project, including new chests for the pipes, will be completed in April 2019. We would like to thank Dr. Phillip Burgess, Associate Chair of Music and Mr. Bill Graham, Chair of Trustees for their trust in the selection of a Rodgers Organ to be used for the many weddings and services that are held in this beautiful chapel.
